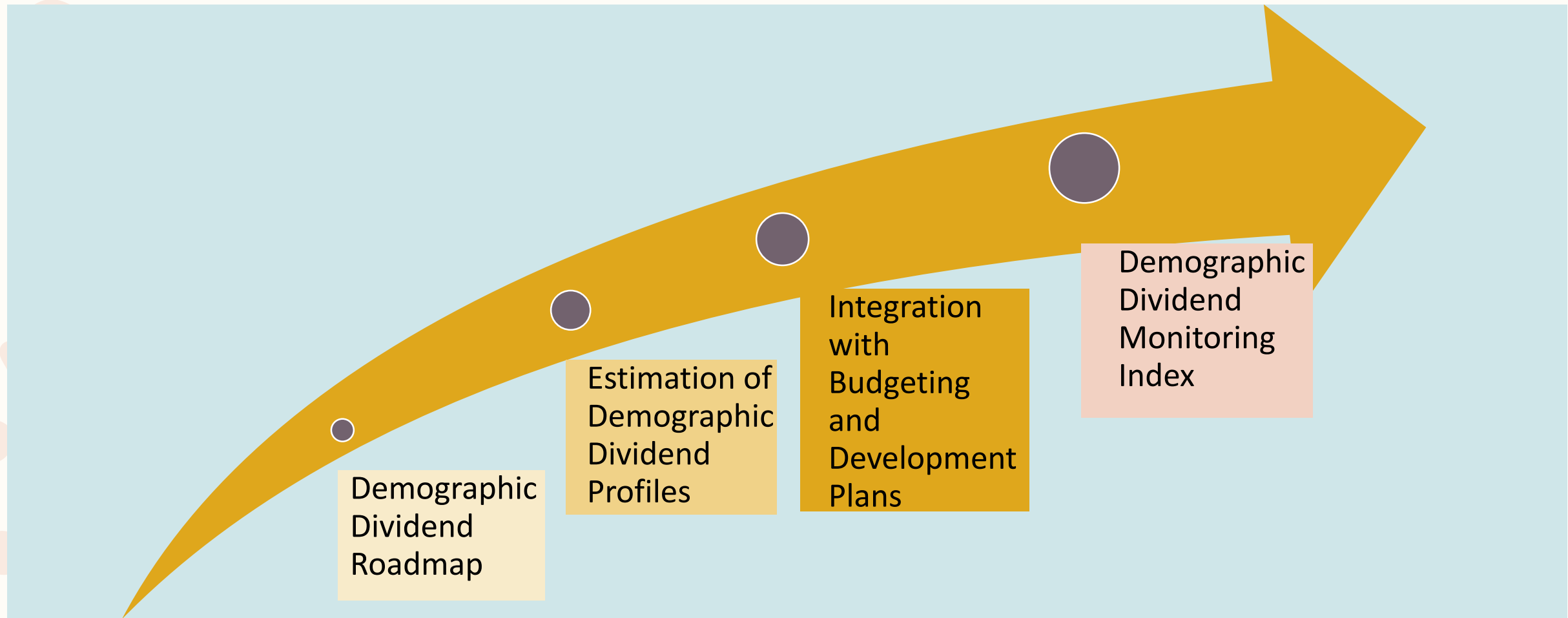
# 3 Introduction

- the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) framework computed to directly monitor the thematic pillars of the national roadmap.
- provides a performance matrix to identify areas of strengths and areas for rigorous policy attention.
- tracks the progress made towards creating and harnessing the DD.
- reinforces the country's efforts towards achieving the:
  - ✓ AU Agenda (2063)
  - ✓ Global Agenda (2030- SDGs).

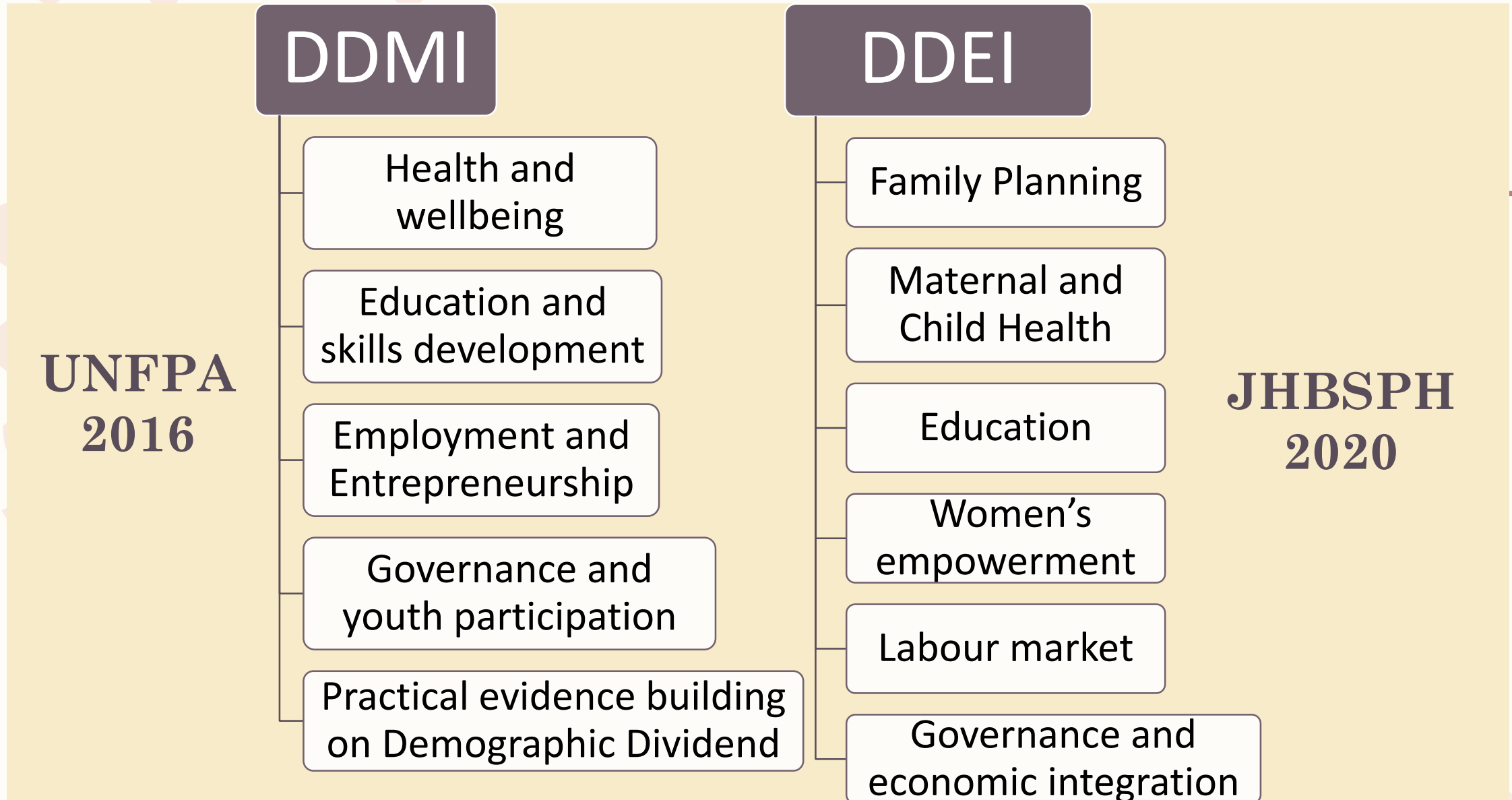

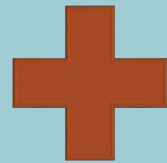

# Steps in the construction of DDMI

## STEP I: Identifying the Dimensions (Components of the DDMI)

Dimensions are the thematic pillars of the DD Roadmap.

These dimensions are:

1. Health and wellbeing;
2. Education and skills development;
3. Employment and Entrepreneurship;
4. Governance and Youth participation;
5. Practical evidence building on Demographic Dividend

## STEP II: Identifying the Domains, Sub-domains and Indicators

There are the investible areas that will lead to progress in the identified dimensions.

Policy levers are also identified as sub-domains for the DDPI: policymaking, services and programs, advocacy, research and civil society.

## STEP III: Data Requirement and Sources

Developing data templates

Stakeholders meeting with about 85 experts in the DD Space

Appointment of State focal person for primary data collection

Data sources identification, verification and usability

DDPI Data collection through questionnaire

Collection of secondary data for the DDOI

## STEP IV: Obtaining the Index for the various sub-domains, domains and dimension

DaData Transformation

Weighting and Aggregation

Computation of the three indexes (DDPI, DDOI and DDMI - the composite of the DDPI and DDOI indexes)

## STEP V: Designing the Dashboard

Dashboard the three indexes (DDPI, DDOI and the composite of the DDPI and DDOI indexes)

Dashboard presented at the dimension, domain and sub-domain levels

# 13 Data and Sources: Outcome Index

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- Data for the indicators utilized were sourced from both domestic and international databases for 2021/2022.
- These are official databases that are reliable, publicly available and easily accessible (DHS, MICS, Digest of Education Statistics, WASH-NORM – NBS, CBN, Worldbank, etc)
- Selected indicators and data are validated through the National Transfer Account Global Network.
- All indicators are adjusted and normalized to ensure that they all have common units

# 14 **Data and Sources:** Perception Index

- **Indicators:** Policymaking, Services and Programmes, Advocacy, Research and Civil Society
- **Population:** Experts in DD Activities at national and sub-national levels working with Federal Government, State Government, Private Sector, NGOs/CSOs, Development Agencies, and Researchers
- **Sampling Technique:** 3-stage – 1st: *clustered* sampling into 6 GPZones; 2nd: *purposive* sampling of 21 States and Federal Capital Territory (FCT); 3rd: *random* sampling of 1,218 experts in the relevant organizations.
- **Instrument:** Eight (8) sets of questionnaires adapted from the DDEI but largely amended and structured for country-context.

Weights are assigned to Dimensions, Domains, Subdomains and Indicators based on:

- *relative importance in DD achievement*
- *peculiarity to the entity context and*
- *closeness to the Agenda 2030 and 2063*

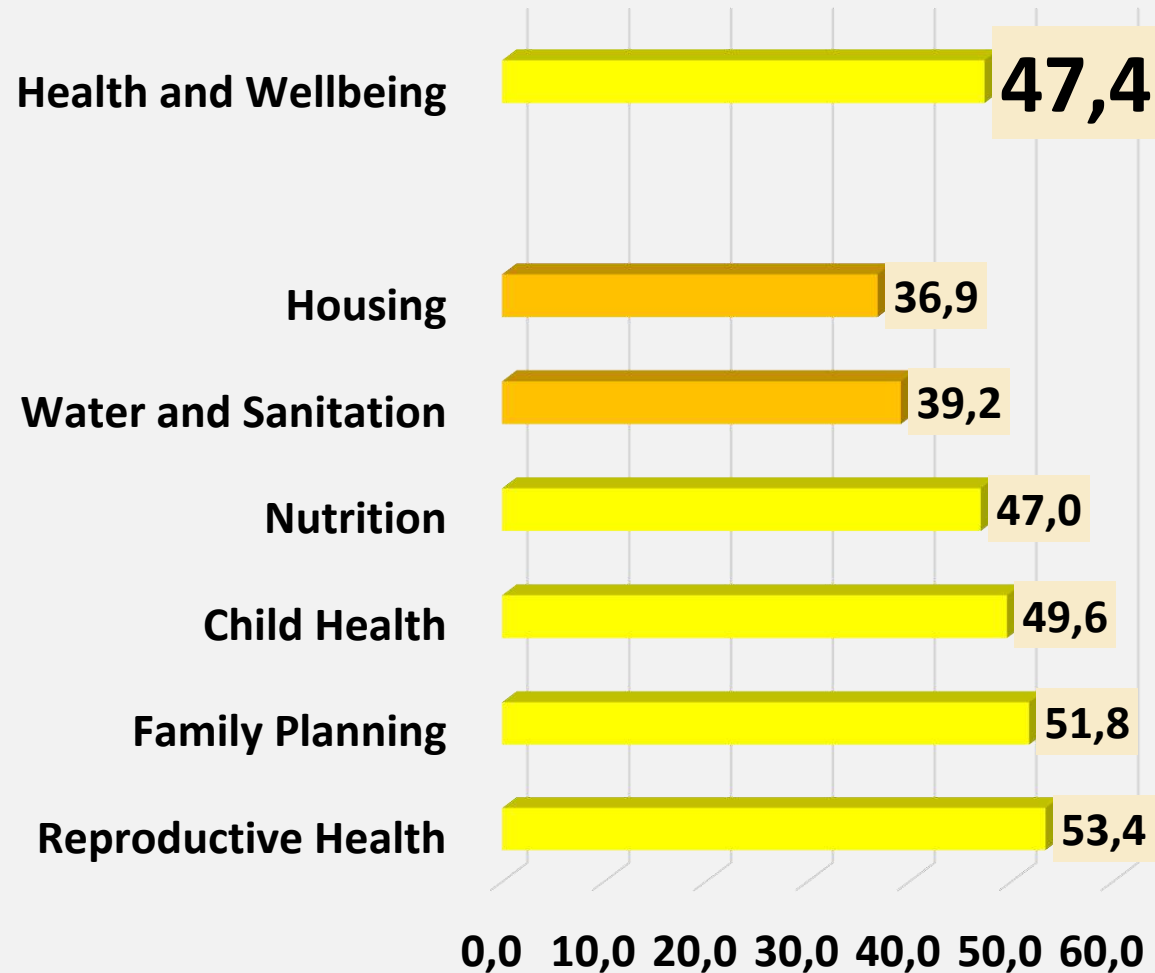

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## Classification Criteria of the Performance of the Index

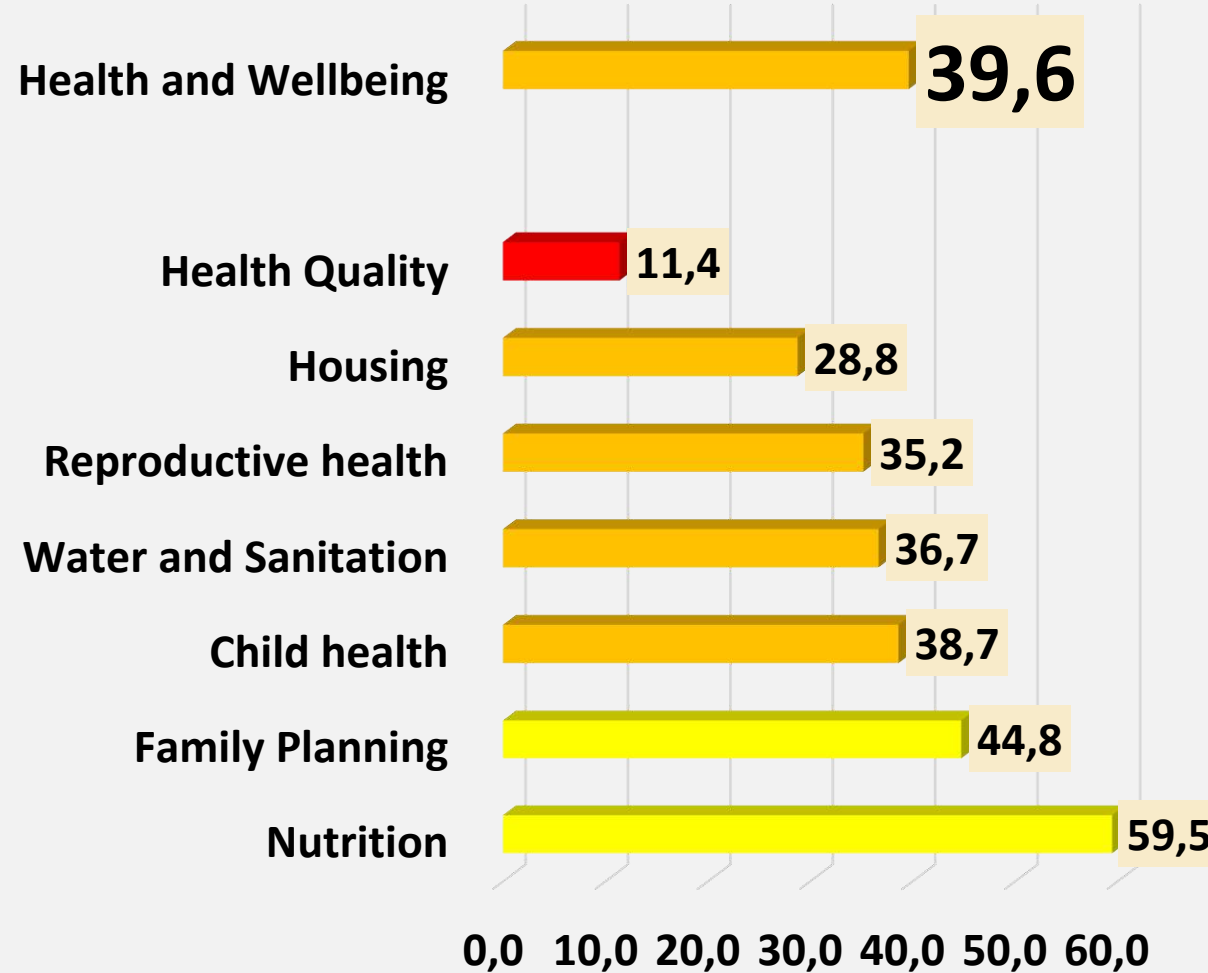

## 30 CONCLUSION

- Outcome Index - 38.7 percent (poor progress)
- Perception Index - 48.6 percent (average progress)
- Overall Performance - **43.7** percent (average progress)
- DD intervention in the country needs to be scaled up.
- While some progress have being recorded, efforts are still very low in the provision of employment and entrepreneurship opportunities as well as building practical evidence on DD .

# 31 RECOMMENDATION

- Affordable and quality reproductive health care services and control child mortality
- Accessible and effective avenues for the Nigerian youths to acquire practical skills outside of formal education and training systems
- Support for individuals with diverse learning needs and disabilities for inclusive growth
- Scale up programme and service provision
- Promote research-driven development
- encourage collaborations between academia, industry, and government MDAs
- All the states of the federation should embrace the demographic dividend programming to hasten their development
